



WETTIE CARE

Thanks for purchasing a Wettie from EKF. We hope you enjoy using your Wettie. With good care it will serve you well.

1. Wettie's are generally all open cell suits. This means they are smooth on the inside. They **must** be soaped up to put on. A warm soapy water mix (conditioner, shampoo, dish washing liquid) works best. Make sure the inside of the long johns and jacket is well coated. If the suit does not go on easily, squirt more liquid in. If done correctly, it is easier than any other suit with zips to put on.
2. Open cell suits are warm, comfortable, flexi and easier fitting than lined suits. Go to the EKF site and check out the Wettie TV episodes "What Is Open Cell Neoprene" and "How to put on open cell suits".
3. Take care with the inside of your suit. The outside has a durable nylon layer. The inside does not. Be careful with fingernails or sharp objects particularly when taking the suit off. Wettie build in a nylon base panel on the inside of the jacket waist area to help remove suit.
4. Do not leave your suit in direct sunlight or heat for extended periods of time.
5. Do not wear your suit in chlorinated/saltwater swimming pools.
6. Wettie has a 5 year warranty against manufacturing and workmanship. Warranty is covered by Wettie for all suits purchased through EKF. Contact EKF for any warranty issues. Policy on website.
7. Wash your suit in freshwater and properly dry it inside and out before storage.
8. MASKS. New masks will fog up if not treated first. You can burn the inside or use toothpaste. Check out Wettie TV episode on "How to choose a mask"
